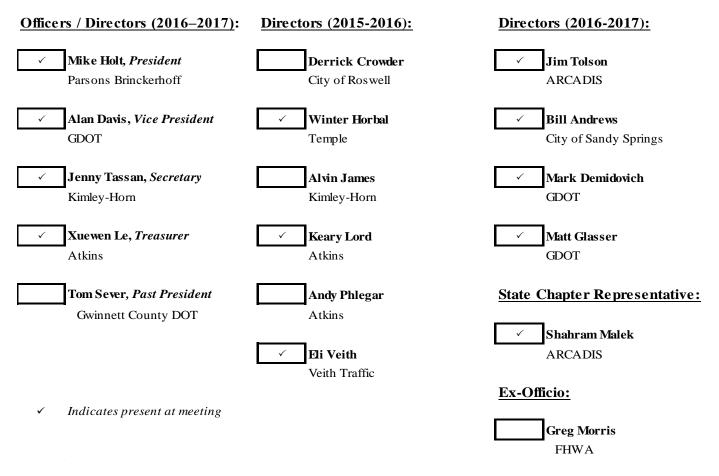

Constructability by Design

A classroom presentation with PowerPoint visual references. The target session time is approximately 2.5 hours. (1/2 day with intros, credits and breaks)

The training session will cover typical Traffic Signal and associated ITS design scenarios and challenges faced by design teams as plans are developed. Field examples with lessons learned and industry standard practices to avoid the pitfalls.

Training material will be developed by long term industry professionals compiling experience, challenges, road blocks and the solutions developed to enable an acceptable conclusion to projects. Topics included are:

- Kick off and initial plan development, including on-site survey. What you can't see in Google Earth.
- Understanding the client's design requirements and the conflicts that will arise. There are times the anticipated design and the local intersection environment will not cohabitate. Expect R/W challenges and accuracy of information provided by others.
- Effective identification and resolution of utility conflicts. Become familiar with local utilities, their contacts and installation practices. Make ready can become a fire breathing dragon. Look up! It's a jungle up there, too.
- Good plan development starts with the General Notes page. Housekeeping is typically the order of the day.
- Become familiar with the clients standards and specifications and incorporate into the plans, creating an equitable bid environment.
- Sometimes the "default" standards aren't satisfactory. Avoid last minutes "band aid" solutions by understanding the physical requirements of the devices being specified.
- Familiarity with construction techniques is a must. Create relationships with vendor and contractor representatives. The need for design advice is just around the corner.

The goal of the training class is to present typical design challenges and the solutions that have been applied in order to create Traffic Signal and ITS construction plans that are equitable and constructible. This reduces delays and subsequent change orders. The presentation will include career experiences of the contributing professionals.
