<p>Welcome</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A motion to approve meeting minutes for the Feb 27, 2019 board meeting (motion by Andrews, Taylor support) – the motion was approved unanimously. 	
<p>Budget/Financials</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2018 financial statement: Johnson confirmed that the financials for 2018 5C Summit have been closed-out. ITSGA income from the 2018 5C was \$60,259.19; this far exceeded the expected/budgeted amount of \$25,000. The final version of the 2018 financial statement (year-end) was distributed by Johnson for final board approval (see also attached). A motion to approve the 2018 YE financial statement (motion by Horbal, Phillips support) – the motion was approved unanimously. Johnson officially closed out the financials for 2018; ITSGA ended 2018 with a net profit of \$31,377.86. 2019 financial statement: The February monthly meeting sponsor was 360ns; Le to verify if they have paid their \$500 sponsorship (follow-up to collect payment, if needed; update financial statement accordingly). The social committee requested an increase in the social budget; because ITSGA is not having a Holiday event at the end of 2019, the social committee is coordinating additional social events throughout the year. One of these events is the MB Stadium tour on 5/29; social committee has other ideas for events but would need additional budget to do so. Johnson will analyze budget and report back to the social committee at the next board meeting. Andrews received final invoice from City Springs for the 1/19 Holiday Hangover; total amount owed for the event is \$6,300.19 (including room rental, food catering, and open bar). ITSGA and GAITE will split (50/50) all financials for 1/19 Holiday Hangover. Johnson provided final financials for 1/19 Holiday Hangover. There was a total income (from registrations) of +\$1,995; there was a total expense (\$334.75 for entertainment; \$481.22 for door prizes; \$6,300.19 for room rental & catering) of -\$7,116.16. Therefore, there was a net expense of -\$5,121.16 for the 1/19 Holiday Hangover; GAITE and ITSGA will each be responsible for -\$2,560.58. Because ITSGA fronted all costs, Johnson will coordinate with GAITE in collecting their amount owed of \$2,560.58; Johnson to request GAITE to send their payment to Le. 2018 Taxes: Johnson stated that the deadline for taxes in previous years was May 15th. Le needs to confirm this date ASAP. <p>Committee Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities: Glasser gave all speaker gifts to Crowder; Crowder will be responsible for distributing speaker gifts for all 2019 events. • April Meeting: UPS presentation at Aviation Community Cultural Center. Wakhisi is coordinating the speaker. The sponsor has been secured; Axis is 4/24 sponsor and has already paid their \$500 sponsorship. • May Meeting: joint with ITSGA/GAITE/ACEC regarding the Super Bowl story; Thurs, May 9. GAITE has requested that ITSGA handle the registration. Location is TBD; ITSGA/Andrews to look into the City Springs meeting site as an option. This event replaces the ITSGA May 29th monthly meeting date. Johnson stated that there will still be a board meeting on May 29th; the May 29 board meeting will be from 10 AM – 11:30 AM at the Kimley-Horn Peachtree Corners Office. • June Meeting: Micro-mobility, including Lime presentation. • July Meeting: at ARC, ARC-related content. • Training Options. Johnson suggested an ITSA PCB course to replace the August (8/28) or September (9/25) monthly meeting. The board agreed that the Cybersecurity Basics course was a good option; Johnson to coordinate with ITSA on availability. This would be a half-day course, including lunch; Andrews to check availability of City Springs for both 8/28 and 9/25 (8 AM – 4 PM). Wakhisi mentioned having a technical tour in early December (Wakhisi will look into Delta or Kroger); possibly hold event at the Delta Museum. Horbal also mentioned having a technical workshop + social at Nitrozone in Norcross as an early December event (similar to Whirley Ball + ATSPM that Glasser coordinated in Dec 2018); Johnson mentioned having an idea for technical workshop and will follow-up with Horbal via email. • Awards: scheduled for Nov 13, at Maggiano's Cumberland. Johnson has secured a contract; Le has paid deposit. Glasser suggested changes to the ITSGA "Best of ITS Awards", for general consideration; Glasser and Johnson will collaborate on ideas and present potential changes to the board in April. • Communication and Outreach: April 1 is the due date for ITSA Award applications; Wells to submit ITSGA application before this deadline. The <i>Engineering Georgia Magazine</i> column is due on March 29, and the theme is energy and environment. Derek is the featured volunteer. Send Wells fresh ideas. Send ideas to Wells for this too.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elections: nothing to report. • Legislative: Wireless comm and 5G are a subject of legislation. There is legislation in both houses for broadband in rural areas. Small cell bill would remove the ability of cities to manage small cell sites within the ROW. • Membership and Finance: GDOT and Jacobs have not yet paid; Johnson stated that the ITSGA bylaws require all board members to be ITSGA members. Demidovich and Udell stated that the membership payments for GDOT and Jacobs, respectively, are in the mail; Holt to check ITSGA mailbox at ACEC prior to April 24 board meeting for additional membership checks. Glueckert reported on ITSGA membership ideas to seek input from the board. Potential membership targets are: car manufacturers (Porsche, Mercedes, Kia), TNCs (Uber and Lyft), rentals (scooters, cars, etc.) community organizations (Midtown Alliance) involved in traffic operations, public transit (MARTA, ATL, local municipalities, Gwinnett Transit), in-vehicle devices (Panasonic in Peachtree City), radio manufacturers (DSRC and other), Cisco, AT&T, Verizon. Marietta, DeKalb County, Douglas, Atlanta, Athens. There was discussion for the Membership Committee to consider having a different membership rate for potential members that are located outside of Metro-Atlanta; the committee will consider implementing this idea for 2020 membership rates. The idea was mentioned to consider offering a membership discount for First-time Members; the board unanimously agreed that a discounted rate for first-time members was not something worth implementing as it would not be that huge of an incentive because our membership rates are already so low. • Social: The next social is scheduled for March 28; trivia at Wing Factory Cumberland. The Mercedes Benz Stadium tour is scheduled for May 30, followed by a happy hour. Other opportunities under consideration: April 28 bowling, kid-friendly; Friday, September 20, @ 7 PM, Braves (vs San Francisco), kid-friendly, joint with GAITE; August 23, Concert Series at Marietta Square, kid-friendly; food/wine/beer tour, November. • Scholarship: Taylor requested the board to send him any ideas for the essay question for the 2019 scholarship application.
