2020 ITSGA Annual Meeting (Jekyll Island), Sept 27 - 29,	
2020. Pampolina reported regarding the safety measures that have been put in place: no staff will enter your room; attendees will sign a liability waiver; there is a TV channel set up to broadcast to the rooms; and all social events are outside. Currently, there are 40 registered as in-person, and 16 are registered as virtual. There are 27 total speakers, and 9 will be in-person. Executive Summary:

In the attached documents, please find a comparison for a stand-alone ITS Georgia conference (option 1) and a combined conference with ITS America (option 2). The combined conference concept is illustrated in the attached diagrams, based on early discussions with ITS America. (Note: the 2019 conference was used as a base, since the 2020 conference planning has not yet produced a schedule.)


The Board needs to vote on a direction for the conference due to an approaching scheduled payment related to the JW Marriott contract. Understandably, the status of COVID and the economy in 2021 is a consideration that is very difficult to quantify with respect to anticipated attendance and other factors. The cancellation fee for the JW Marriott contract associated with Option 2 is \$22,800. Beyond that, the revenue impacts related to the options have not been estimated at this time. The combined conference (option 2) transfers risk factors to ITS America, however it also substantially reduces the potential for revenue associated with the stand-alone conference (option 1).

Option 1 (stand-alone ITS GA conference in September 2021): if a vaccine is available by mid-2021, then we expect a normal conference attendance, however economic conditions may persist that suppress attendance for some public sector employees. The JW Marriott has recently provided updated contract language that provides greater clarity regarding the conditions under which the contract could be cancelled at no cost to ITS GA, such as if state-directed COVID rules continue to require avoiding assemblies, etc. The JW Marriott has also verbally expressed a willingness to work with us on lowering minimums if social distancing restrictions are still in place.

Option 2 (combined conference with ITS America in May 2021): the ITS GA registration (\$395) within the ITSA conference is that ITS GA registrants would have full access to ITSA events during the period of Weds morning through Thurs noon (1.5 days); the full ITS America conference is 4 days. "Full access" means that ITS GA registrants may attend other ITSA technical sessions, the exhibition hall, and tech demos during the 1.5 days. ITS GA staff would select the content for the ITS GA-specific technical sessions.



Option 1: Stand-Alone ITS Georgia Annual Meeting

2021 ITS Georgia Annual Meeting in Savannah (JW Marriott); September 19-21

Background: During a typical year, the ITS Georgia Annual Meeting typically attracts approximately 175 attendees and generates approximately \$35,000 - \$45,000 in net revenue annually.

Logistics

- ITS America will be held in Atlanta in 2021, and their conference is different than the typical ITS Georgia conference. One example is ITSGA provides the local networking that an ITS America conference does not provide.
- We have a contract in place with JW Marriott. ITS Georgia was able to get a great deal because we signed a contract before they opened, since we were willing to "invest" in their start-up.
- JW Marriott Contract Addendum: Johnson had Mark R. reach out to the JW Marriott regarding concerns about numbers and accountability, the hotel quickly responded by issuing an updated Force Majeure clause. They have indicated a willingness to work with ITS Georgia.
- Volunteer support for conferences scheduled approximately 4 months apart.
 - ITS Georgia explained to ITS America that we are already under contract for our own 2021 Annual meeting and will require volunteer efforts, however we would help where needed.
 - ITS America's event partner, Reed, plans and executes their conferences, so the demand for ITS Georgia volunteer efforts would be less than for previous ITS America conferences.

Financial Considerations

- Attendance will most likely be lower than normal.
 - o COVID19 concerns may continue to be an issue in September 2021.
 - Potential financial cuts specifically for conferences due to economic conditions, especially for the public sector (similar to this year)
- We will be competing with the ITS America conference (May 2021).
 - To improve the quality of the ITS Georgia events, ITS Georgia requested that ITS America assist with attracting keynote speakers and top technical speaker talent for the 2021 ITS Georgia Annual Meeting event. If both ITSA and ITS Georgia conferences are held in 2021, then attracting top speaker talent will be critical to maximize conference interest and attendance.
 - Given the much higher registration cost of ITS America conference, it is more likely that
 ITS Georgia members will attend the ITS Georgia conference.
 - o ITS Georgia occurs later in the year than ITS America, which makes it more likely that a vaccine is available.

Option 2: ITS Georgia Combined with and Nested Within the ITS America Event

2021 ITS America at the Georgia World Congress Center; May 17-20

Logistics

- COVID19 concerns may continue to be an issue in May of 2021.
- Summary of preliminary discussions with ITS America about a co-hosting opportunity.
 - o ITS America is just beginning to initiate the technical committee meetings and the program has not been developed.
 - ITS Georgia would be working/coordinating more with their event partner (Reed) and weaving in the ITS Georgia "track" into the ITS America program, so ITS Georgia would be waiting on that schedule/program from Reed.
 - o ITS America would take all registration money but did state they would be okay with using our registration cost (~\$395) for those who only wanted to attend the ITS Georgia "track." ITS Georgia registrants may also attend other ITS America technical sessions, the exhibition hall, and tech demos during the 1.5 days.
 - o ITS America would provide ITS Georgia with event space and breakfast/lunch.
 - o ITS Georgia would select the content for the ITS GA-specific technical sessions.
 - o ITS America will not contribute toward the financial penalty regarding ITS GA will have due to cancelling our contract with JW Marriott.
- ITS Georgia would need to go under contract quickly to secure evening event locations, requiring additional contracts.

Financial

- The JW Marriott contract would need to be cancelled. ITS Georgia paid a \$3K deposit in 2019, and the cancellation fee currently is \$22,800 in advance of September 18, 2020. In total, ITS Georgia would have a loss of \$25,800 before considering the costs associated with the combined event.
- The only revenue source for ITS Georgia is sponsorship, and ITS Georgia would be competing
 with ITS America for sponsorship money. The amount of sponsorship funds would need to
 cover the loss of \$25,800 and the cost of evening social events.
- ITS Georgia would likely seek to set up evening social events. These events would compete with ITS America evening events (typically high-quality events).
- There is a concern that people will not come out for the evening events, but rather go home. In a related matter, some of the local agencies (including GDOT) will not reimburse their employees for hotel costs at a local hotel site.
- The 2022 ITS Summit meeting is in Atlanta, so the net result is two conferences in Atlanta in back-to-back years.
