2019 Annual Meeting Discussion Summary	
 Vetting speaker content is difficult due to late-arriving presentations and the freedom given to speakers. ITSGA seeks to promote "speaker freedom" with respect to content and opinion within the bounds of the ITSGA mission. The ITSGA board was given opportunity for engagement throughout the process of developing the technical session content. It is functionally impractical for the session moderator to 	
"monitor" speakers for content during a presentation.	
 Take-aways and Strategy for 2020 Summary New Recommendations A 3-person team consisting of ITSGA members from the public sector, consultant, and a vendor will review all ITSGA meeting speaker opportunities. A disclaimer will be added to meeting materials which is similar to the following: "Opinions conveyed by the speaker are not those of the ITSGA organization." 	These recommendations will be implemented immediately and apply to all ITSGA meeting speaker opportunities.
Continuing Practices Regarding Speaker Content	
 To the extent practical, presentations should continue to be project-centric. The chairpersons of the monthly meeting and annual meeting events should continue to keep the ITSGA board aware of presentation content in advance of the events. 	
 Other Practices, at the Discretion of the Event Chairperson Speakers should be encouraged to submit their presentation a minimum of a week in advance of the engagement, to provide adequate time for the moderator to review for content. To maintain a project-centric focus, private sector speakers should co-present with a public sector speaker when 	
appropriate.
