# ITS Georgia Legislative Report - April 2013

# ARC Report - 4/24/13

Over 2,500 bills and resolutions introduced during this session - some were defeated, some passed by both chambers and sent to the Governor; most did not make it through on time or simply stalled.

# Bills that passed:

- GRTA received \$560K in the amended FY 2013 budget and \$8.1M in the FY 2014 budget for continuation of the Xpress system
- GDOT legislative agenda:
  - HB 202, Value Engineering Studies adjusts the minimum threshold for requiring VE studies from \$10M to \$50M; exempts federal earmarks, interstate projects and freight corridor projects from congressional district balancing.
  - SB 70, Design-Build Changes expands the selection process to include best value bidder through weighing of requirements defined by the department
- SR 618, Senate Study Committee on Public Transportation in Metro Atlanta creates committee of up to 5 Senators selected by President of Senate

#### Bills that may come back up in 2014:

- HB 264, The MARTA Act
- 5B 92, Revenue to Transit allows sales tax revenue generated from vehicle rentals to be applied to transit
- HB 99 and HB 153, Fractional Sales Tax for SPLOST
- SB 73, Changes Penalty in TIA Legislation
- HB 195, Changes Definition of Special Districts in TIA Legislation
- SB 196; Motorcycles in Toll Lanes removes toll fees

#### **GDOT Report - 4/17/13**

In addition to GDOT's Legislative Agenda – HB 202 and SB 70, other legislation of interest that passed:

- SB 218 modifies annual emergency tow permits
- o HB 407 conforms state law to MAP-21 requirements regarding 2<sup>nd</sup> DUI offenses
- o HB 211 exempts school systems from motor fuel tax for State FYs 2014 and 2015
- HB 371 subjects on-road liquefied natural gas to motor fuel tax
- HB 142 imposes \$75 cap on legislative gifts
- Road dedication resolutions (38) must be paid for by requestor or local government

# GEA Legislative Coalition Meeting, 4/17/13

Michael "Sully" Sullivan, ACEC Executive Director's Report -

<u>HB 549, Professional Licensing Committee</u> - establishes a House Study Committee on Professional Licensing Boards to do a comprehensive review of licensing board structures to determine whether the current structure optimizes efficiencies of scale and provides the appropriate state entity to oversee each particular licensing board, etc.

A good example of a self licensing profession is the State Bar. Self licensing would drive up rates. Right now, Secretary of State's office implements the licensing process and collects around \$24M annually. \$20M goes into the State General Fund. If self-licensing were implemented, the state would have to address this \$20M shortfall in the State General Fund. State budget is currently at \$17B, the same level as in 2001. Dentists and pharmacists licensing has been removed from the Secretary of State; Secretary will be opposed to any other removals. A professional licensing board would probably be more proactive than appointments by the Governor. Need to have the entire profession on board as in opposition could kill the bill. Issue — many/most professions don't pay their own annual professional fees — but GDOT engineers do.

<u>HB 142 and 143, Ethics</u> – institutes a \$75 limit on meals and gifts to legislators from lobbyists – but no limit on how often. There are numerous exceptions, e.g., entertaining an entire committee, subcommittee or delegation is still allowed. Despite the exceptions, the bill represents a significant restriction from the current "no limit" lobbyist gift rules.
